

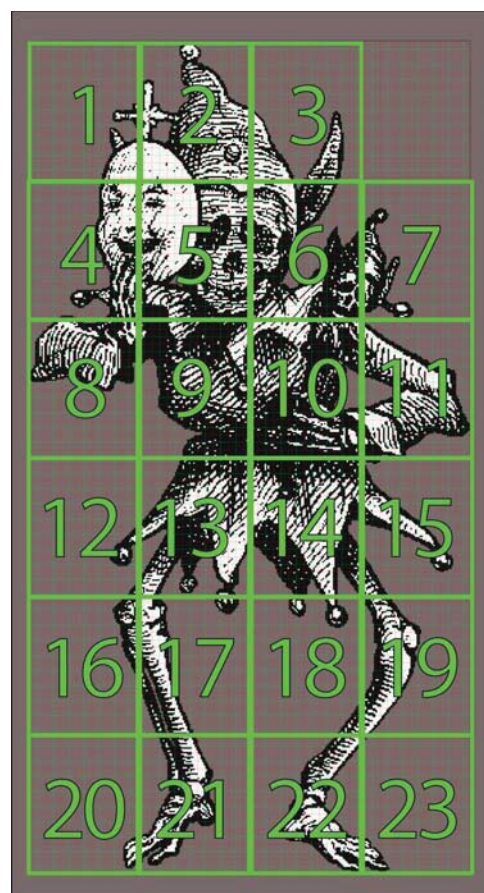

For this series of illustrations, the main figurative artwork was carried out by Charles Henry Bennett and the ornamental part by William Harry Rogers.

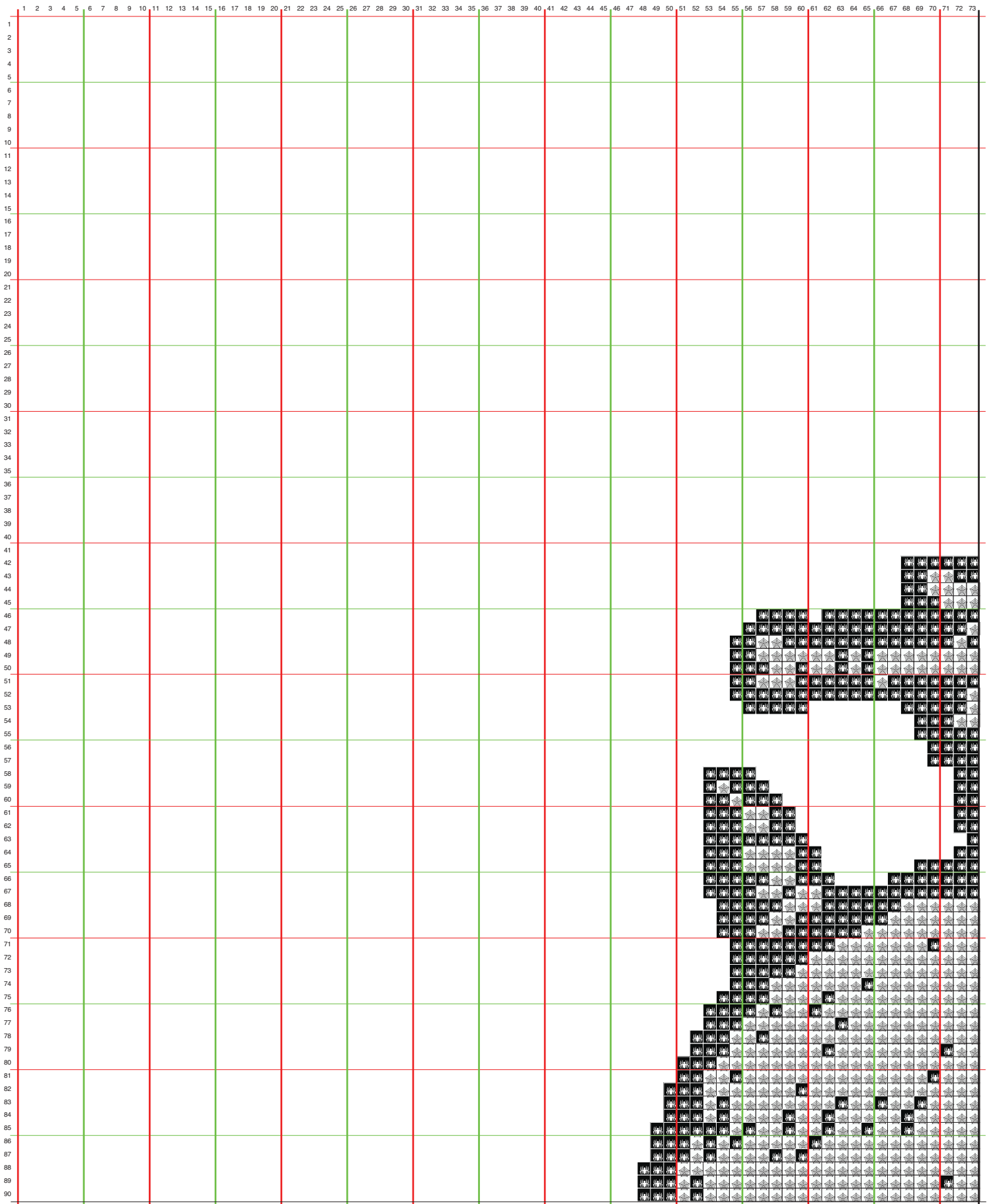


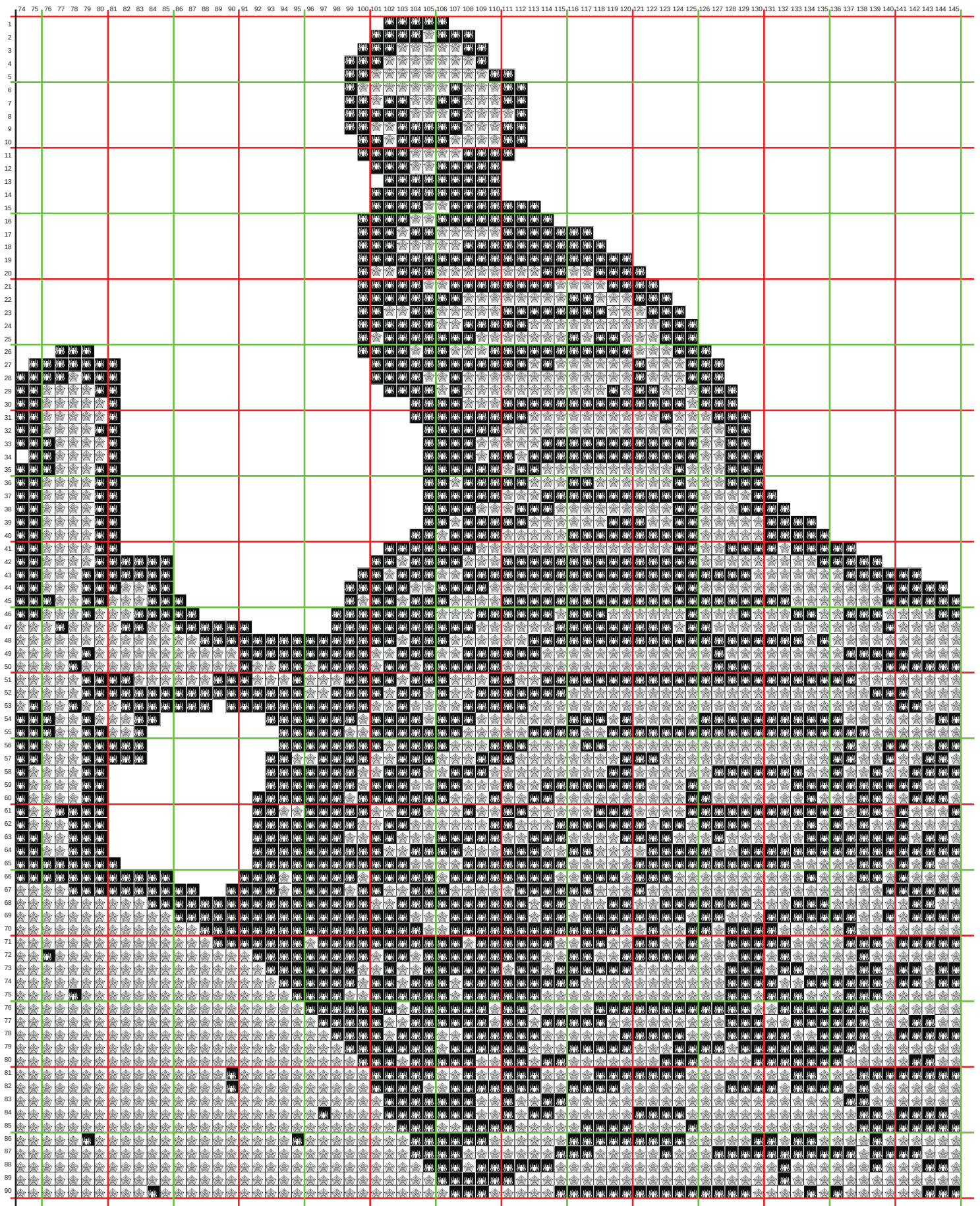
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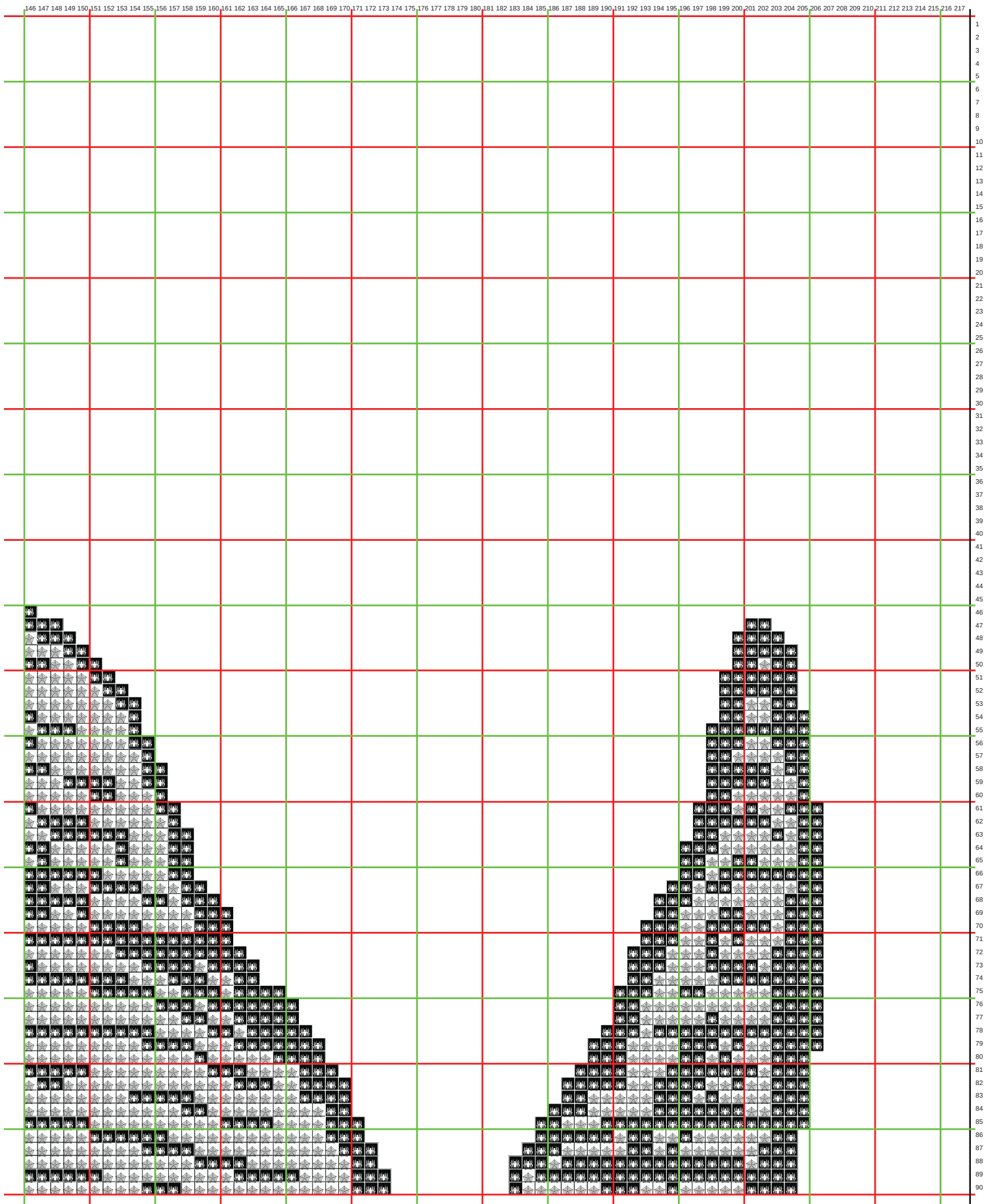
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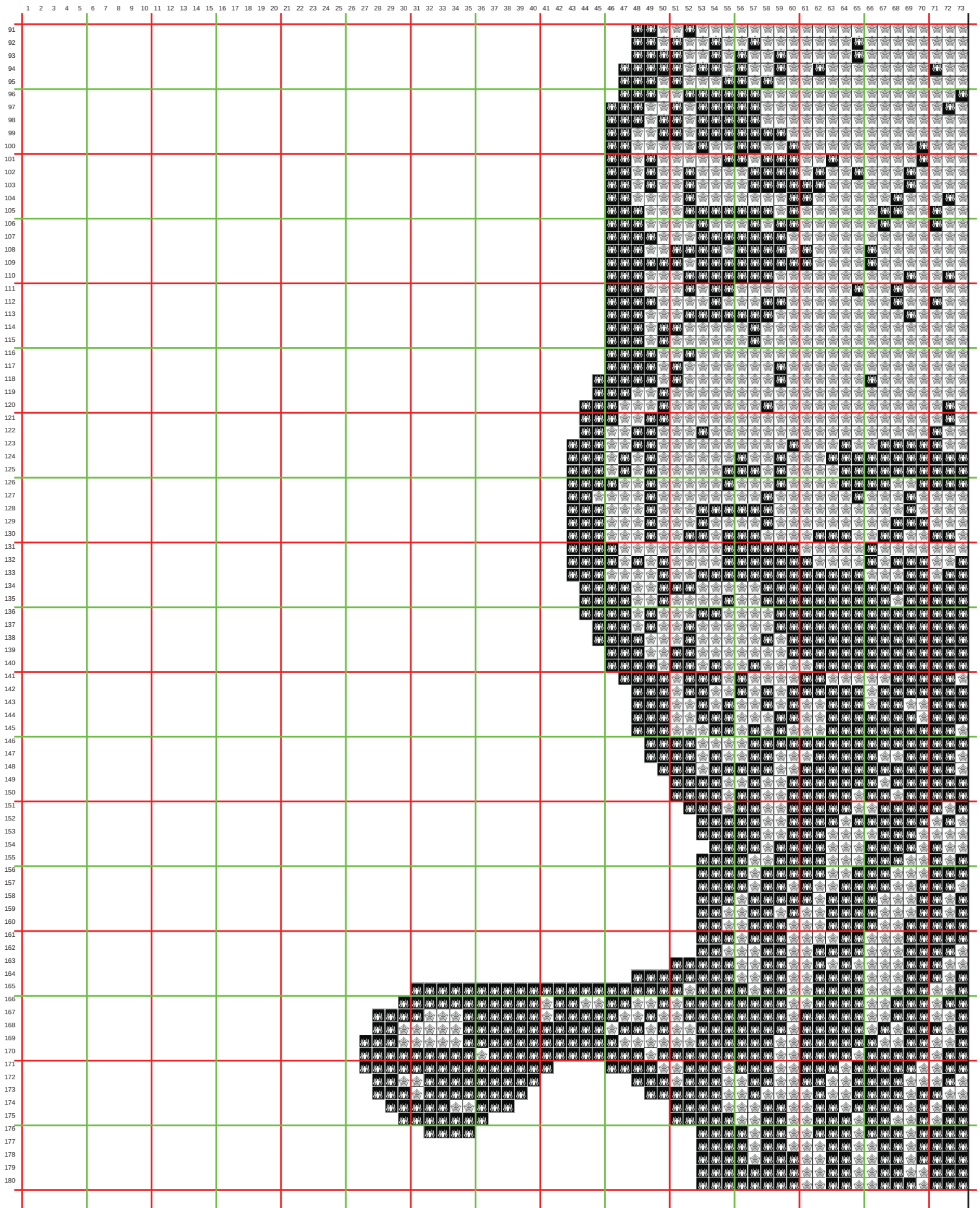
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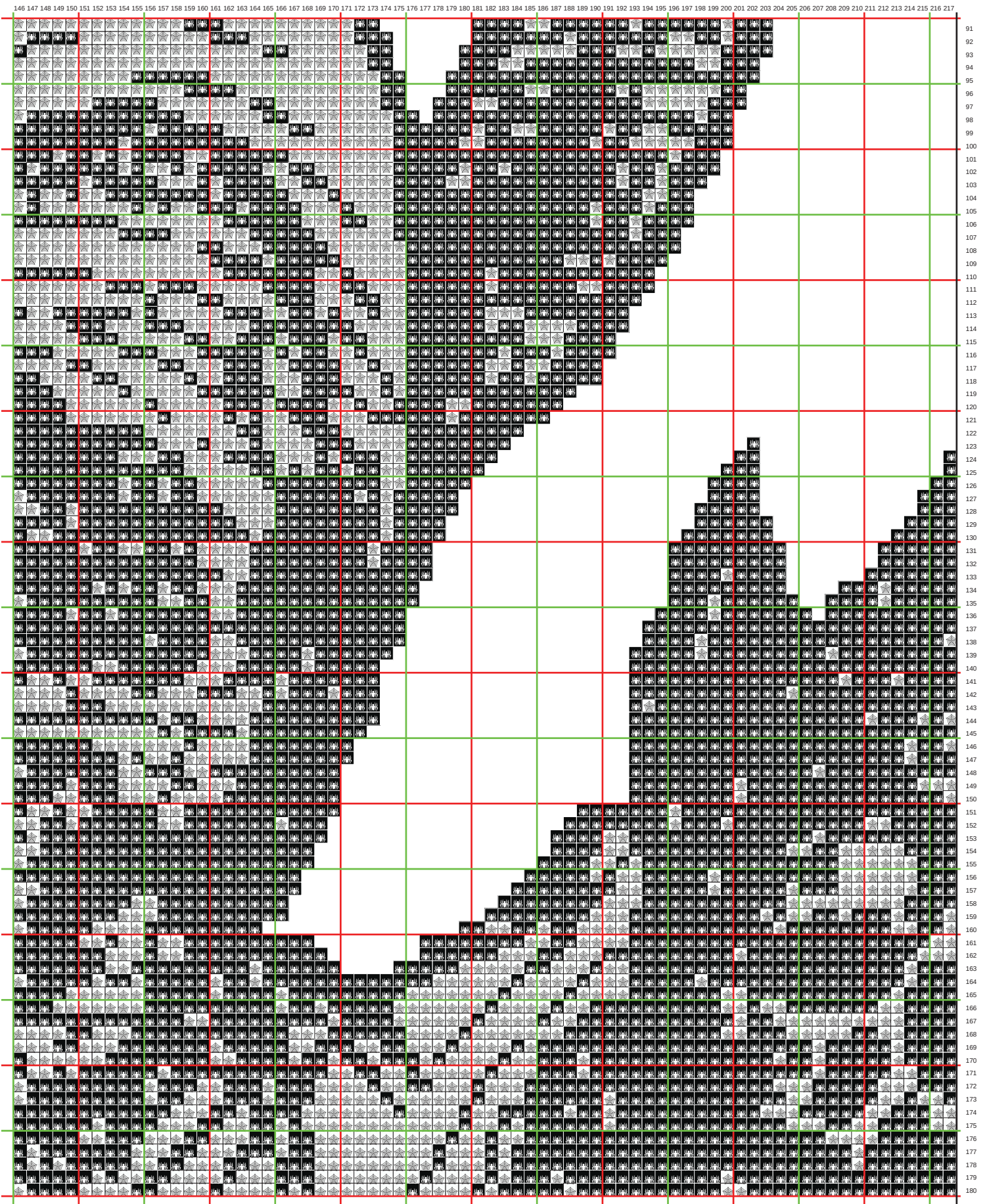




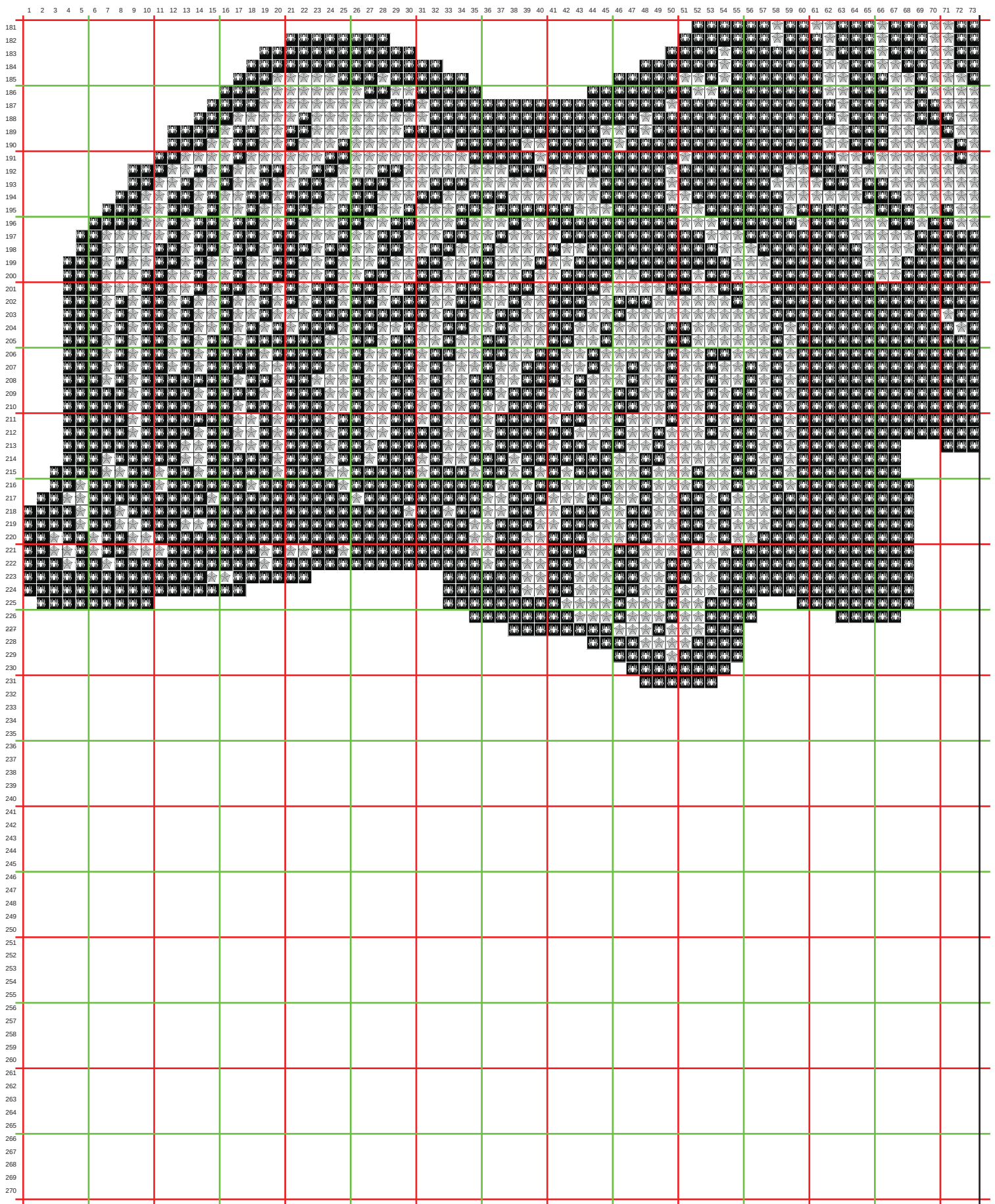




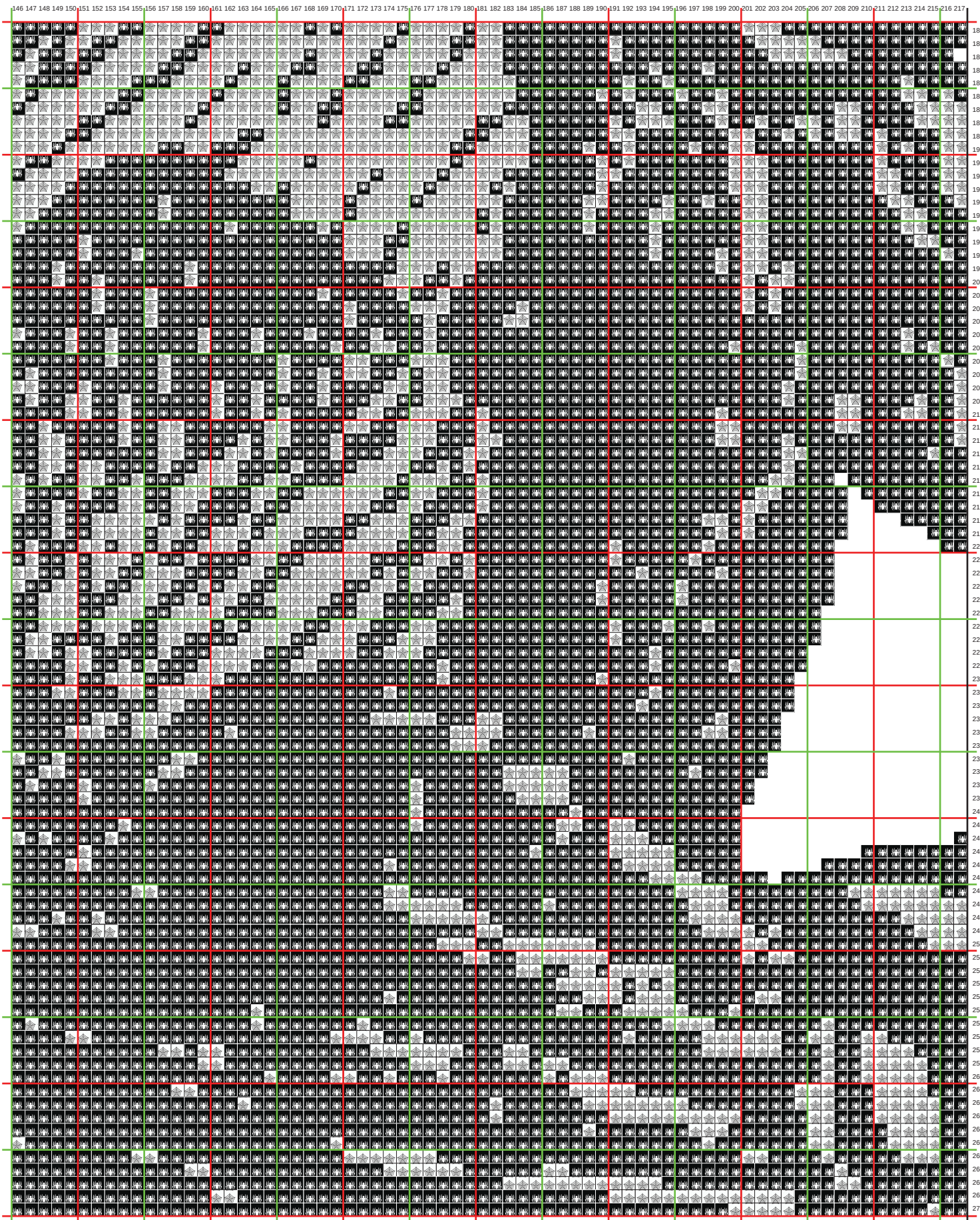


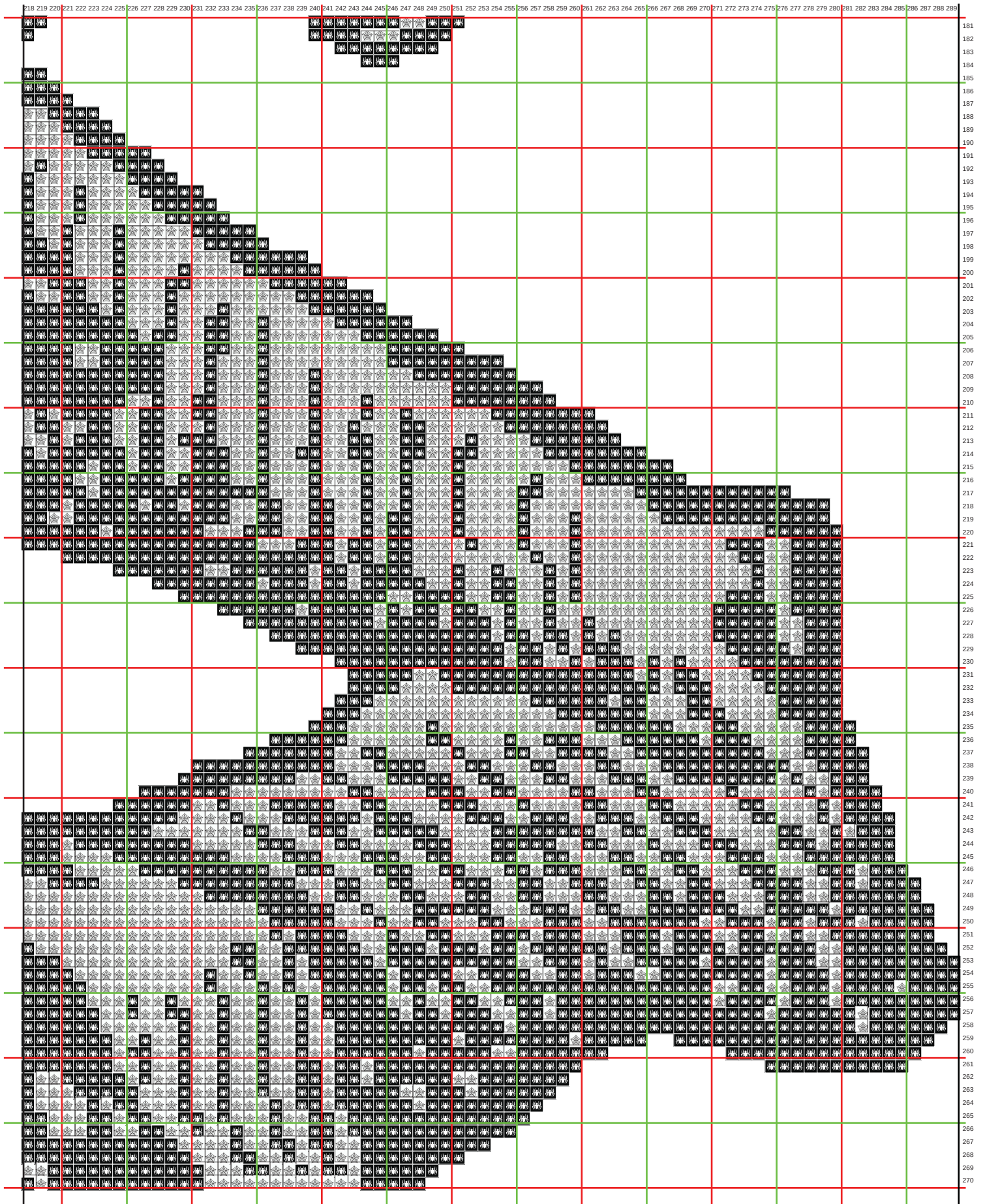


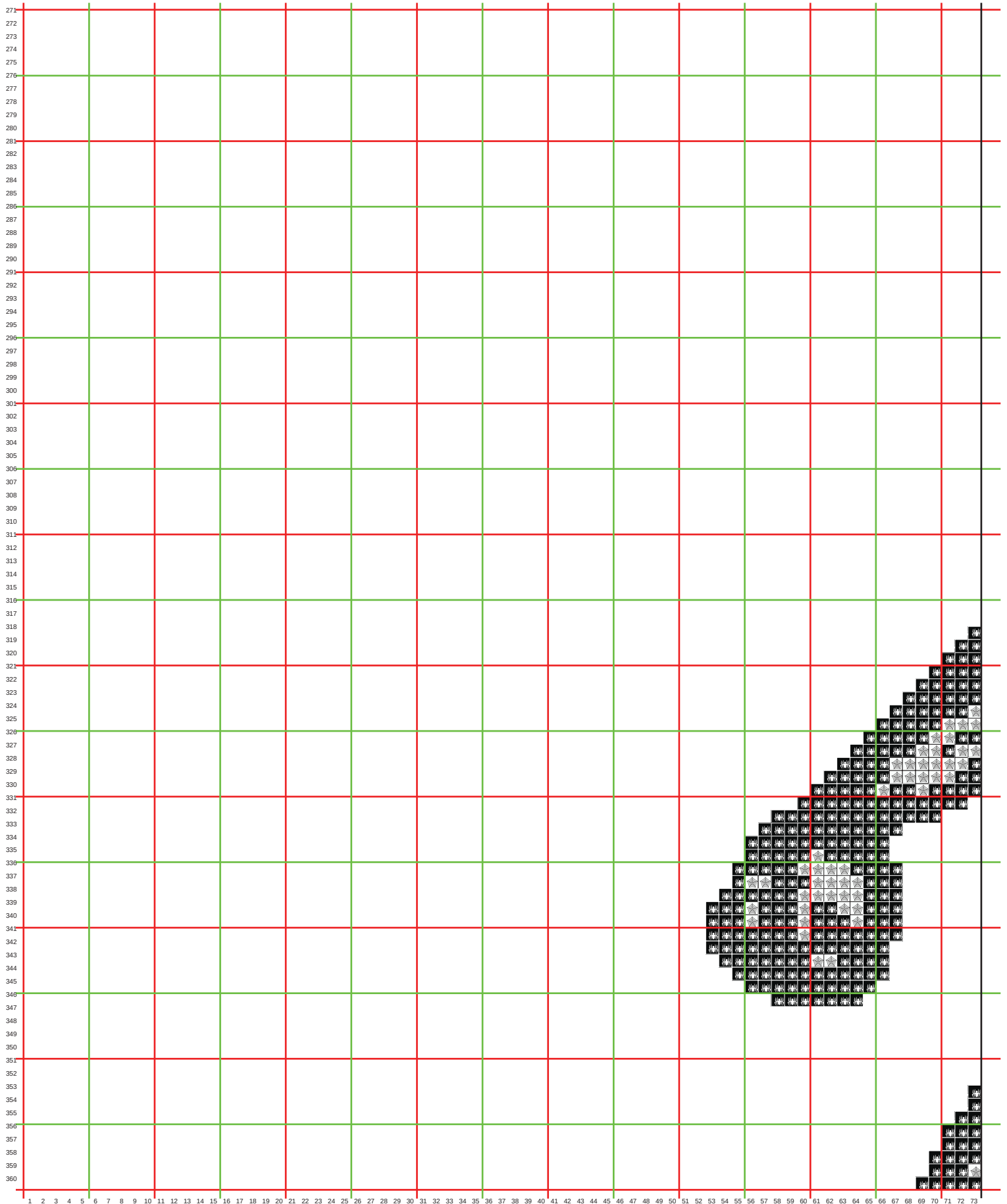
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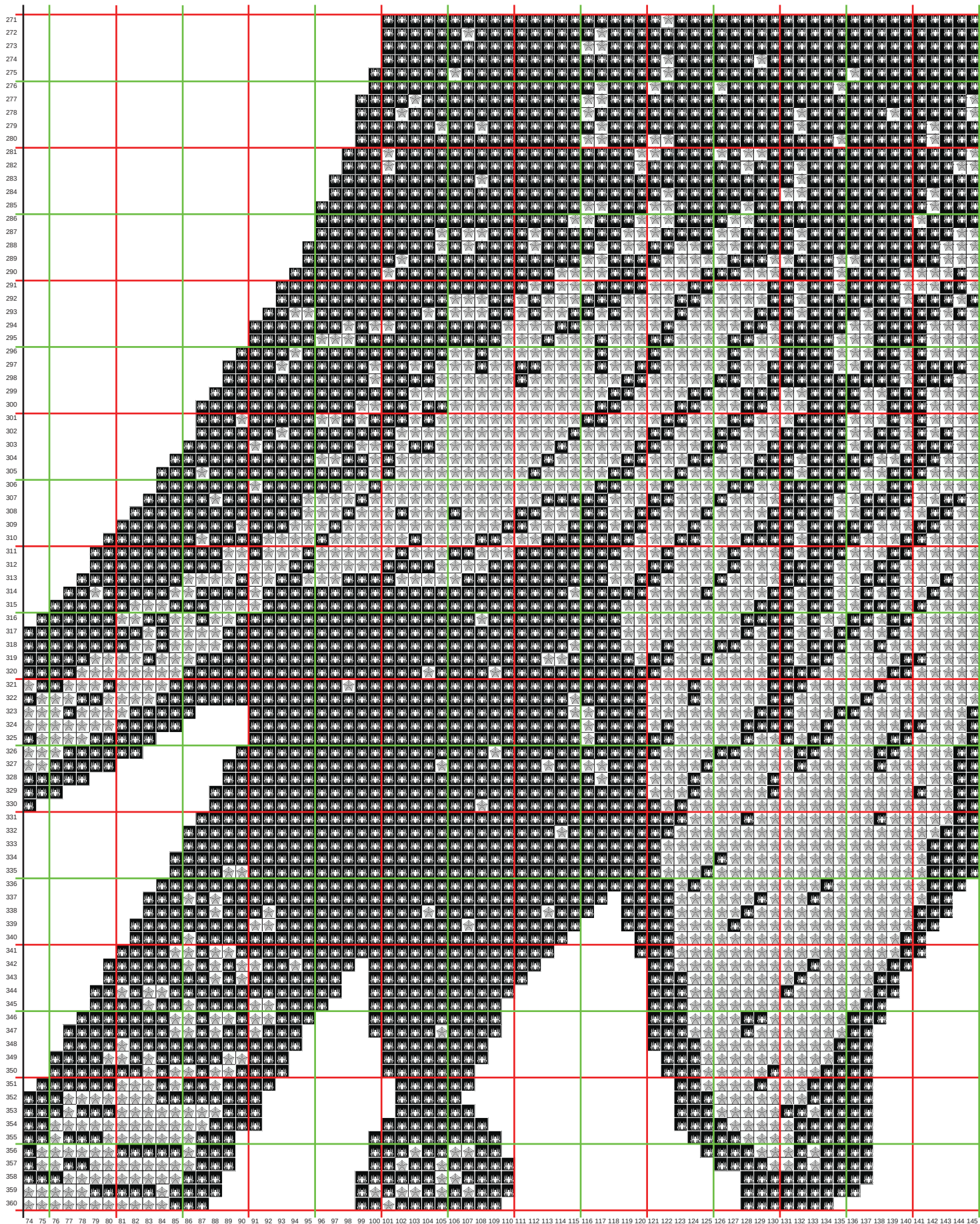


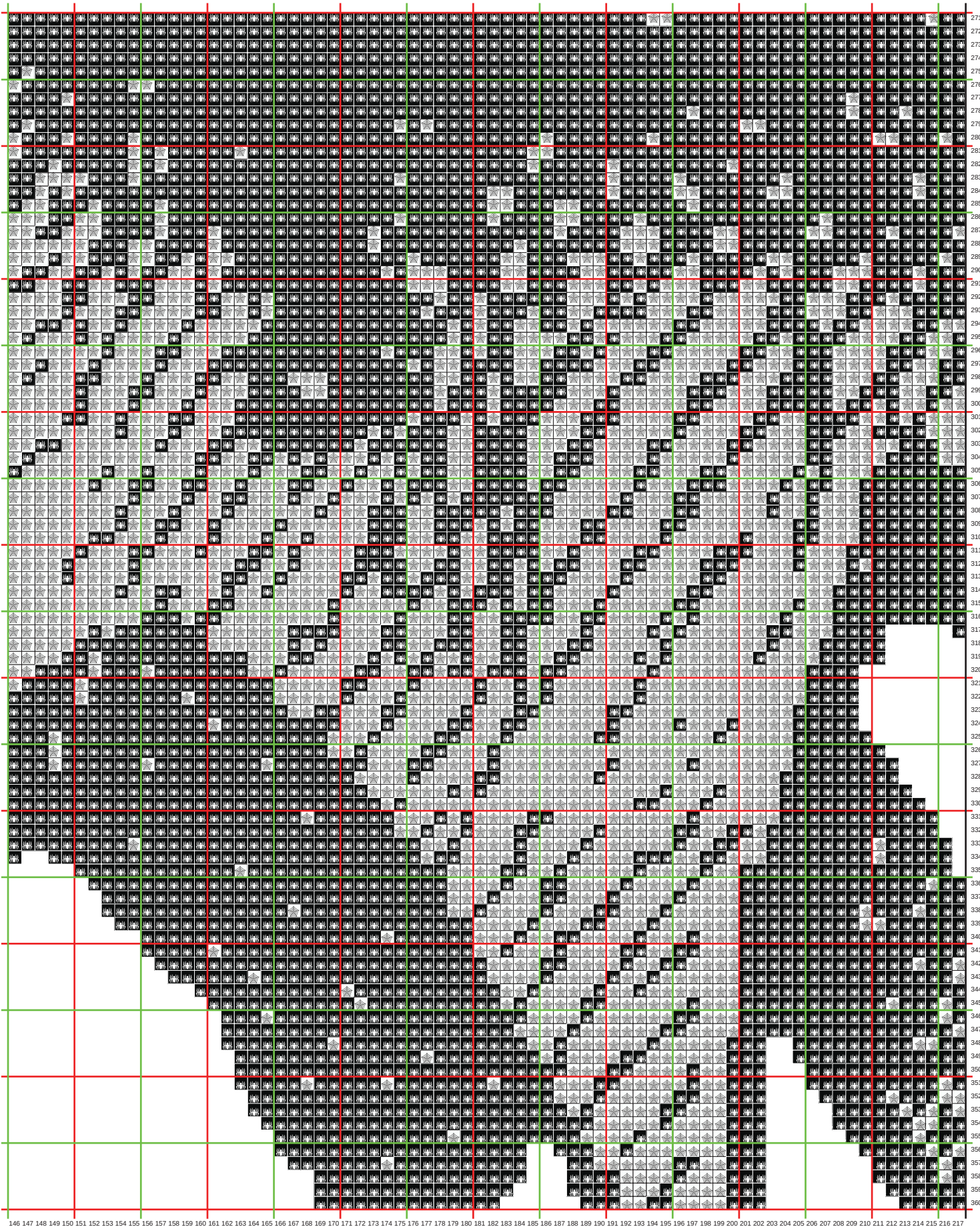
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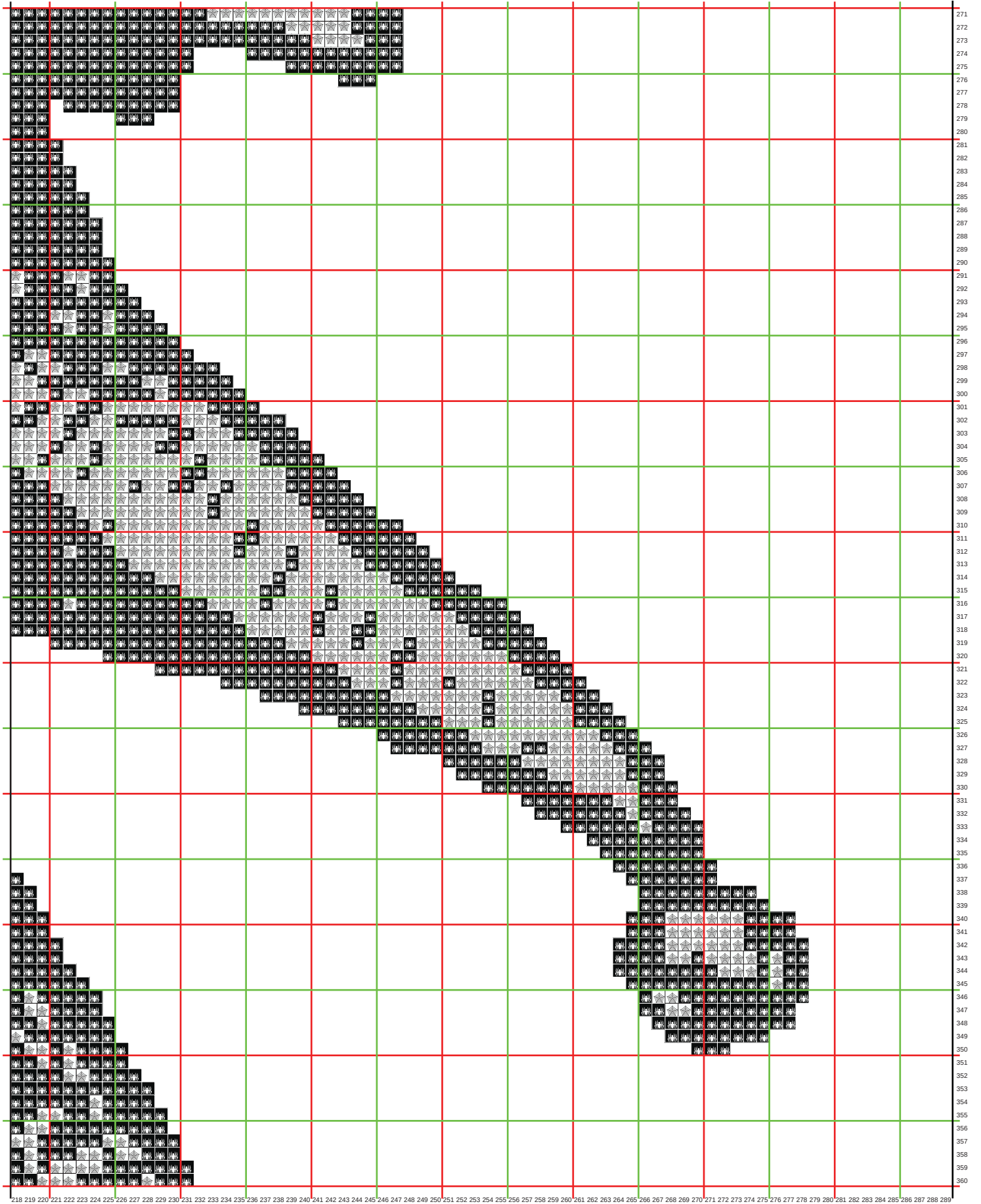




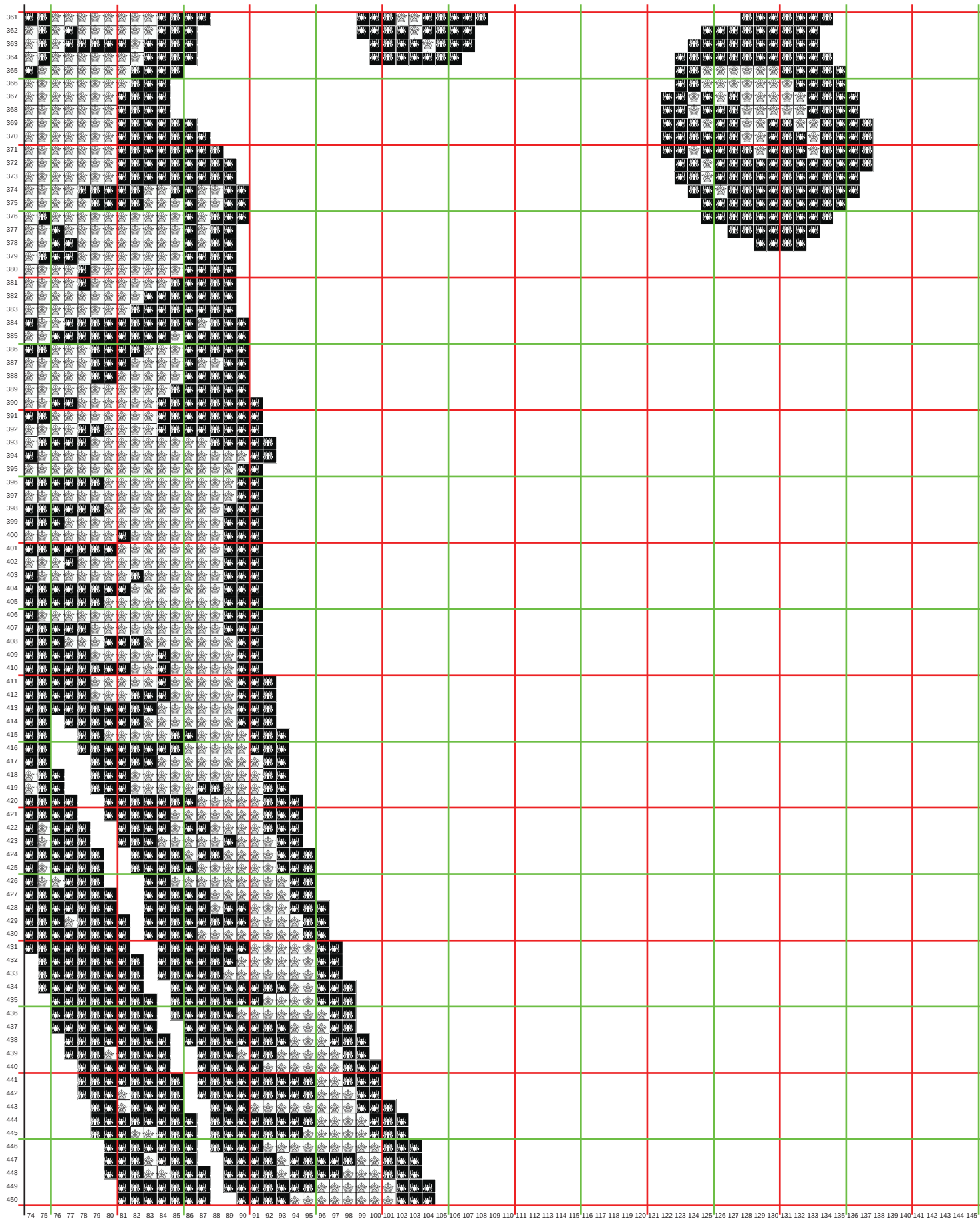


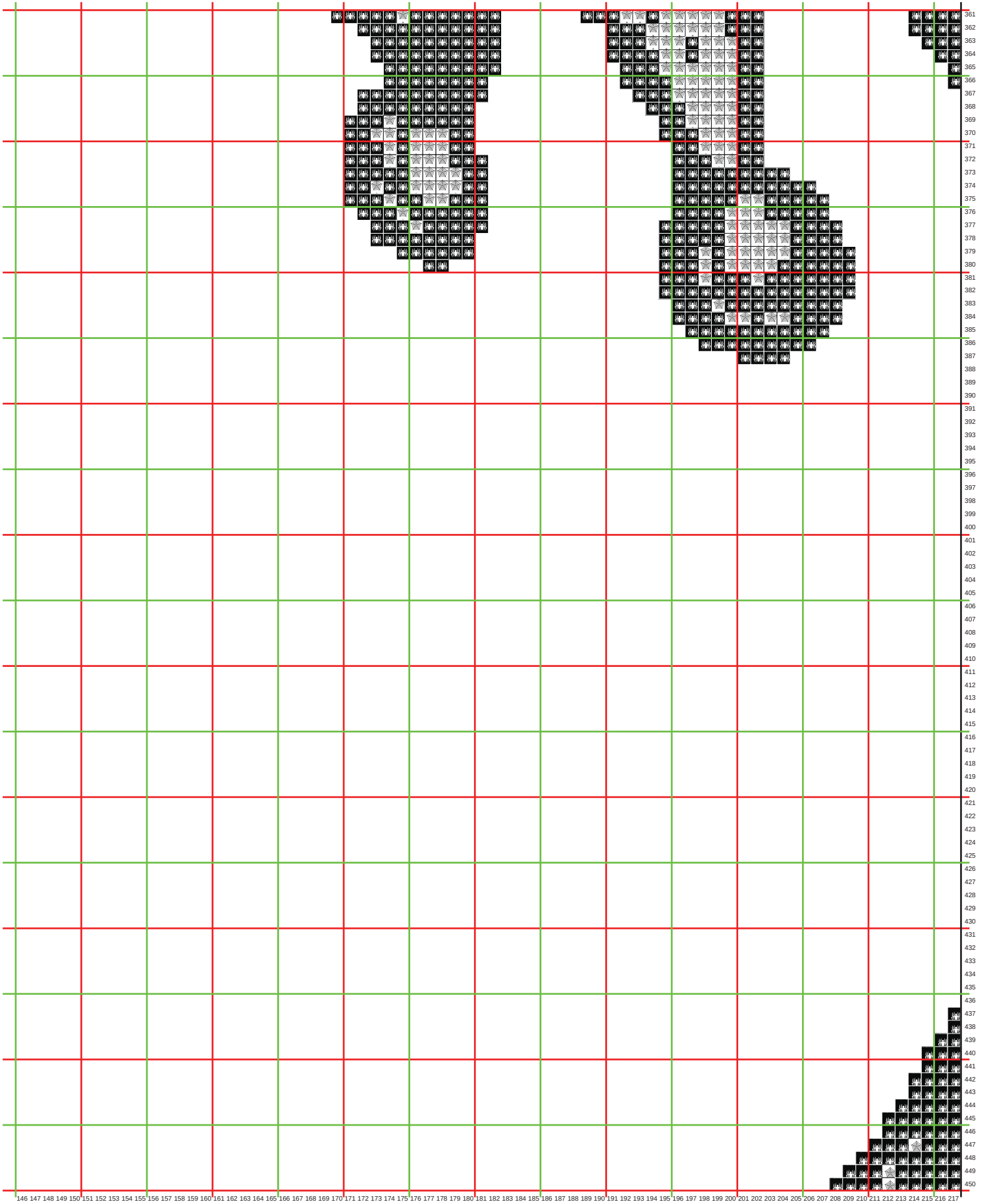


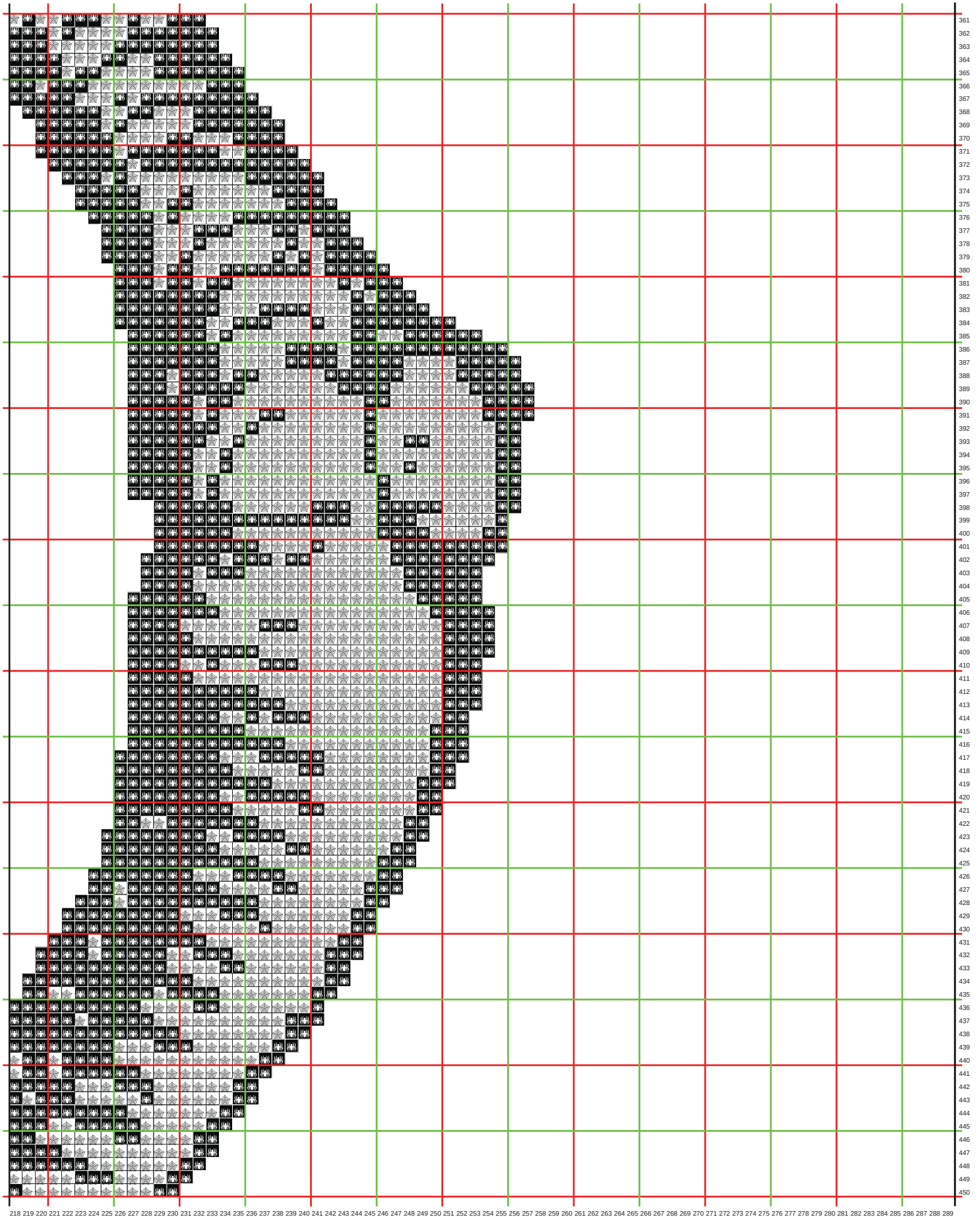


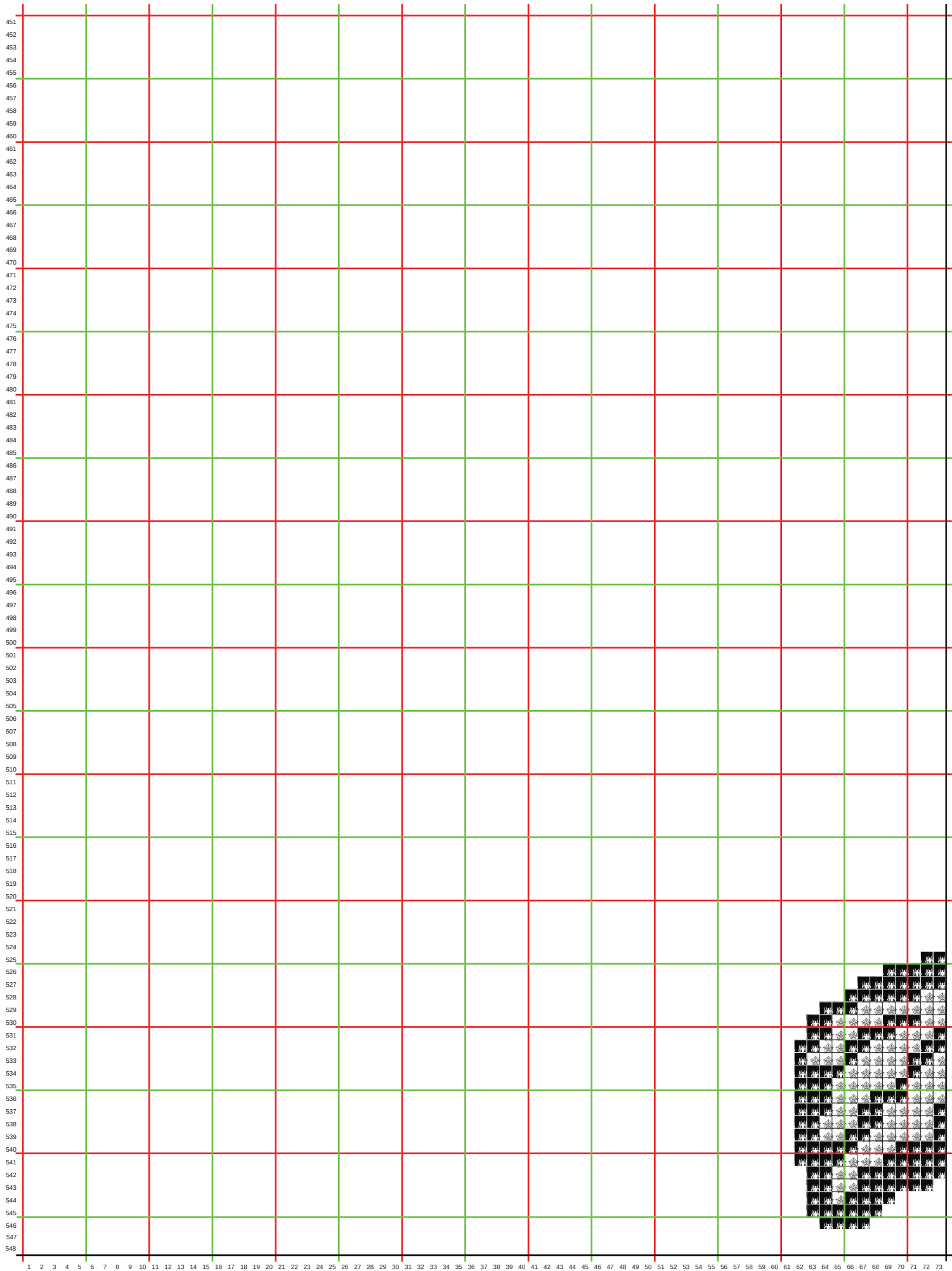


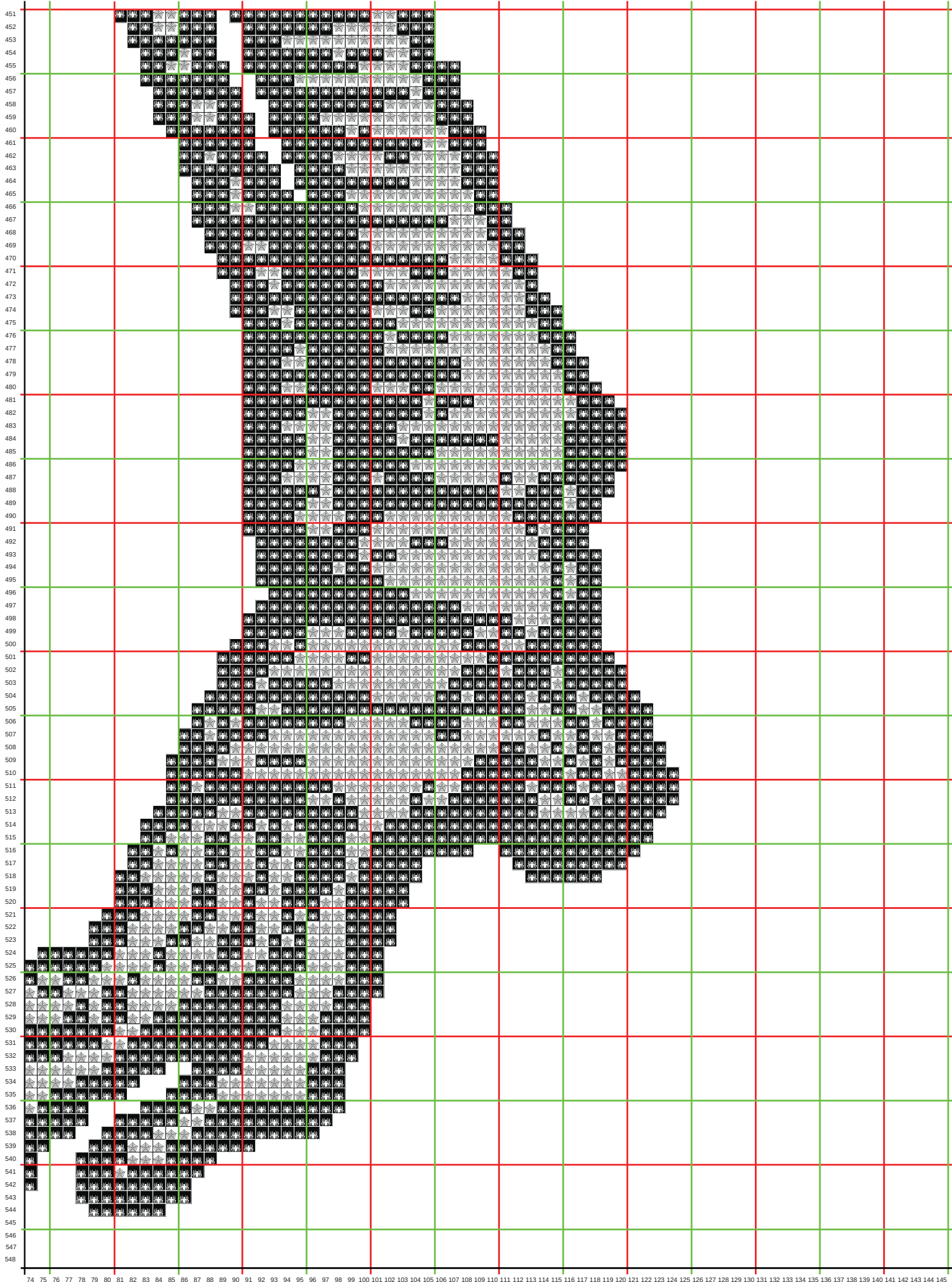
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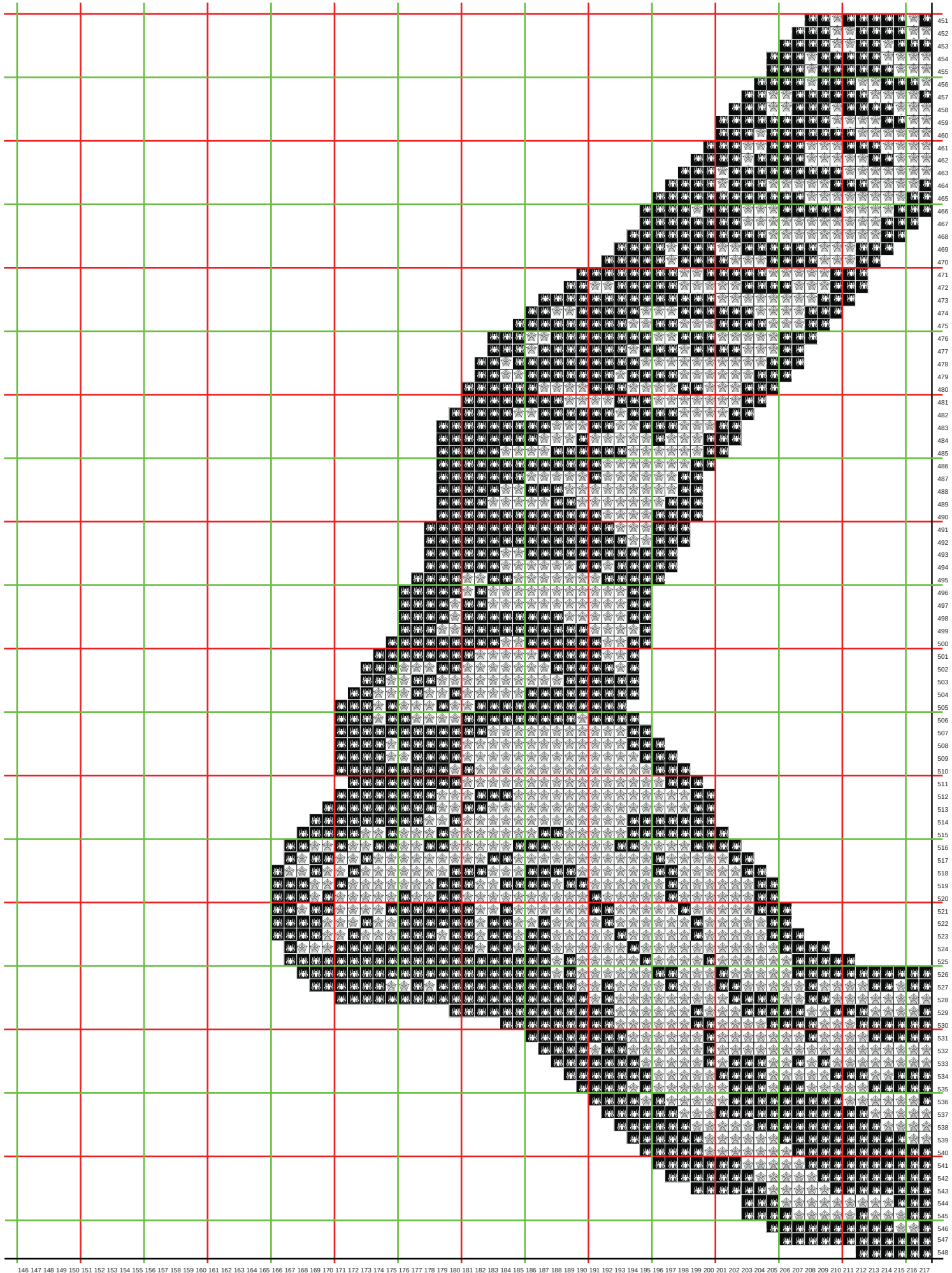


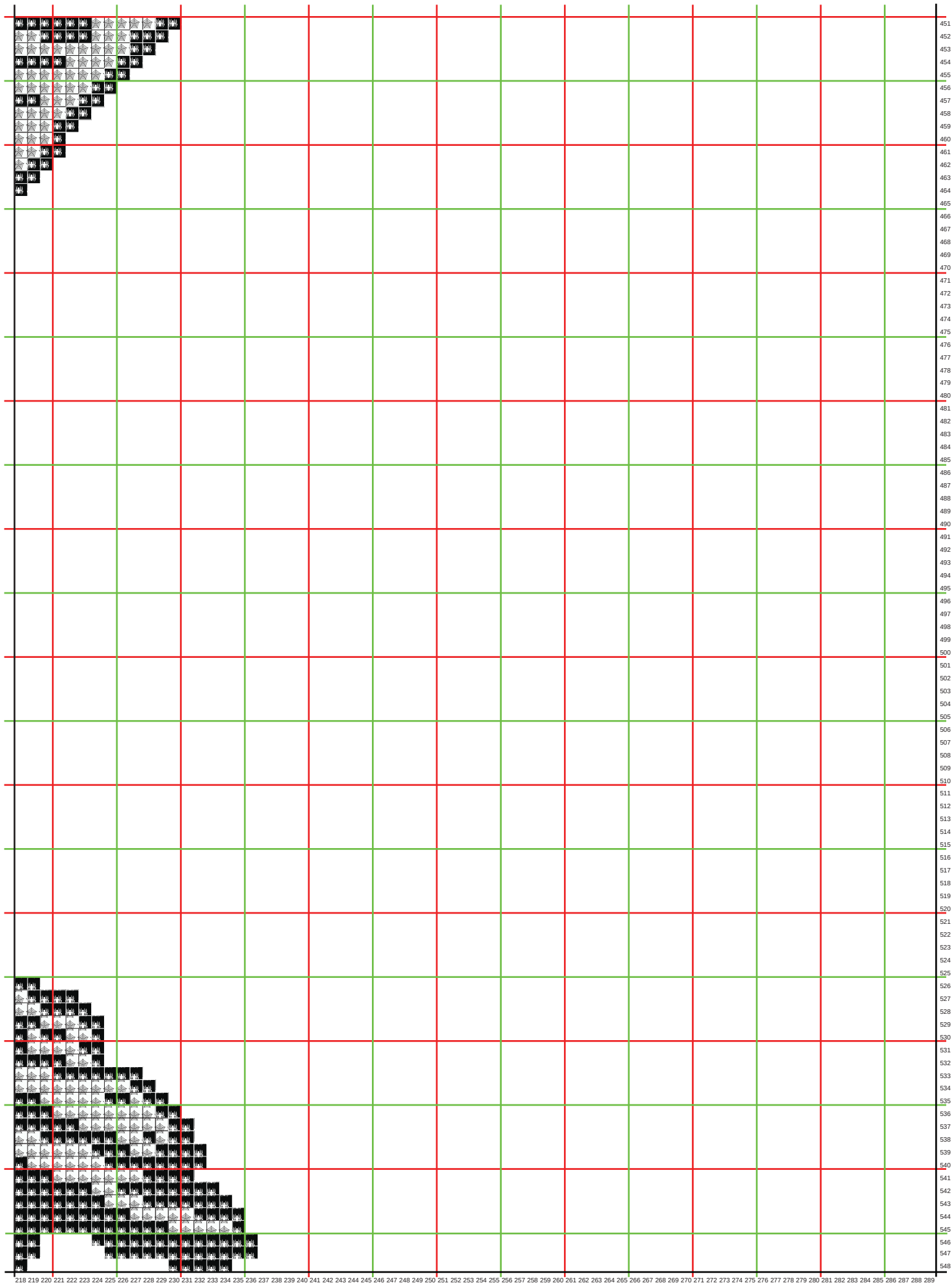












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
